*Riley Holloway - Foundational Oil Techniques (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

In this session, artists will learn the foundational techniques of oil painting as well as personal tips and tricks from the artist.



Riley Holloway, born in Los Angeles, CA (1989), currently lives and works in Dallas, TX. Growing up, he developed an early interest in art, learning from his mother, who is an artist herself. He attended The Art Institute of Dallas and the Florence Academy of Art. Holloway is best known for his dynamic work and fresh look at figurative art. His images are often accompanied by text and personal references embedded within the work. Holloway uses a traditional oil painting technique and bold lines to create depth within the portraits. There is a wonderful counterbalance of softness and masculinity seen in the works.

Holloway's aesthetics create familiar spaces that are rich in storytelling, free from constraints, and true to his subjects. His content is rich in drama, history and intimacy

*Hannah Beimborn - Gouache Landscapes (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

In this session, artists will learn the foundational techniques of gouache painting and the essential elements of a modern landscape painting.



Hannah is a landscape painter living in Boulder, Colorado. She primarily paints small-scale landscape pieces, using gouache as her preferred medium. As a child, she spent most of her time exploring the deep woods surrounding her home in western North Carolina, where she fell in love with the mountains. Now living in the Front Range of Colorado, her creativity is energized while exploring the mountains and plains of the west.

*Raymond Butler - Chalk Pastel Polymer Sculptures (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

In this session, artists will explore the mixed medium sculptures Raymond is known for. Artists will learn his methods, techniques and materials of choice.



Raymond Butler is a local artist from Dallas, Texas whose work primarily focuses on pop culture and childhood memories of growing up in South Dallas, in the 90s. My work builds narratives by engaging with memory as a formal device.

*Whitney Daude - Cyanotypes (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

Cyanotype is a type of photography that uses the sun (or artificial light) and light reactive chemicals on paper or fabric. Whitney will share her techniques on how to capture a unique, and captivating image using this process.



Originally from Ding Dong, TX Whitney received her BFA in Art and Photography from the University of Texas at Arlington in 2017. After graduation she became the Photo Lab Coordinator at UTA, assisting students in navigating studios, digital print labs, an alternative process lab and a black and white darkroom. She is the darkroom manager and a darkroom tutor at the Dallas Center for Photography, a nonprofit arts organization whose mission is to connect the photographic community through education, events and exhibitions. In 2015, Whitney joined Scott Hilton & Bryan Wing of Project Barbatype as the "tintype chemical jockey" and traveled the great state of Texas photographing the men and women

of the Beard and Mustache competitive world. Her passion for photography started in the darkroom with 35mm film and has continued through any photographic process that involves chems and experimentation.

*Temple Owen - Carve Your Own Stamps (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

In this workshop Temple will introduce you to linoleum cutting. By carving a block of linoleum, Temple will guide you through the process of creating your own stamp.

*Perla Vargas - Armatures and 3D Fibers (2 sessions: workshop and feedback)

In this session, Perla will guide artists on her methods of creating unique and unusual characters and creatures using wire and fiber art.



Perla Vargas is a Dallas based artist currently attending University of Texas at Arlington where she is pursuing a Bachelor's in Fine Art. She attended Mountain View College, where she transitioned from 2-D to 3-D. She learned to work with material like resins, wood, metal, clay, and is self-taught in crochet Amigurumi, needle felting and other fiber arts. During her time at Mountain View, she was placed in the League of Innovation where she received an honorable mention for her work in molding and casting and has a wood sculpture that is now a part of Mountain View's permanent collection. Currently her work consists of creating creatures that push the boundaries of reality, making the viewer question the

context and origin of the individual creature. She brings these characters to life with the use of natural and artificial fibers, like wool and acrylic yarn. She is now focusing on the origins of wool and its complete process, from raising and shearing a sheep to cleaning and dying the wool. To that end, she continues to push for authenticity in her work.
